If you see an avenue to serve and Rotary seems like a fit, we'll handle the rest.

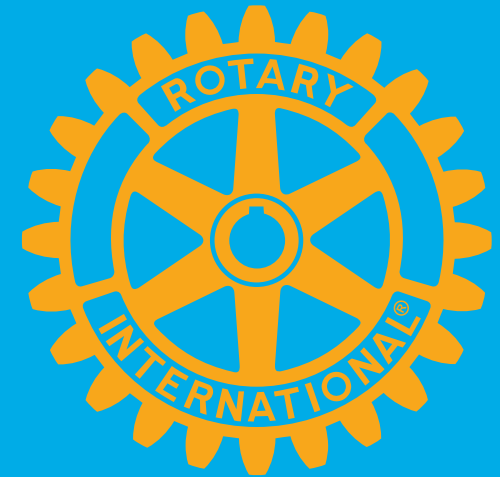

YOUTH PROGRAMS

Greensburg Rotary believes in developing the next generation of community leaders. Our programs help younger leaders build leadership skills, expand education and learn the value of service.

INTERACT CLUB:

The Greensburg Rotary Interact club brings together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills and learn about the world through service projects and activities.

Our local Greensburg Interact Club has over 30 students in the Green County School System.

In 2019, we were able to sponsor 11 student Interact members to attend the 2-day RYLA Camp, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, in Bowling Green.

Our Green County RYLA attendees reported back to us afterwards that it was way more valuable and rewarding than anticipated.
